This summer, multiple units in Business Affairs are working on new programs. One of the new programs launching this Fall is sponsored by Transportation and **Parking Services called Campus** Connector.

The Campus Connector is a farefree, fixed-route, shuttle bus service set to launch in late August. The route of the shuttle service will be along the Newell Drive corridor, providing a critical transit link between the campus core and the UF Health complex. The shuttle will run Monday through Friday, operating from 7:30 am to 5:30 pm, circulating every 15 minutes. This will be a safe and efficient alternative transportation option. More information will be shared by TAPS in the next coming months.
