New Addition by PDC

Veterinary Medicine Renovation by Planning, Design and Construction

Construction of a new \$6 million, two-story addition, will provide more spacious accommodations for primary care and dentistry services, as well as additional offices for administrative personnel. The UF Veterinary Hospital Primary Care and Dentistry Clinic addition adds approximately 12,000 square feet to the existing 100,000-square-foot building, and makes room for expanded emergency and critical care needs as well as routine dentistry care. Additionally, office for the expanding college of Veterinary Medicine faculty was incorporated on the second floor of the addition. This facility is designed to advance dog and cat dentistry prac-

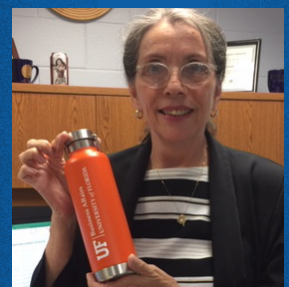
tices as well as train current and future veterinary students to meet professional demands and to accommodate the rapid growth of the hospital's emergency and critical care service. This facility is LEED Gold certified meaning that it is designed and constructed to be resource efficient while providing a clean and healthy environment for pets and their owners.

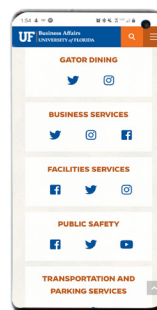
